ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Athawale College of Social Work, Bhandara, Maharashtra established in the year 1992 Sept. 3rd is reaccredited with grade C+ at 1st Cycle in 2004; B at 2nd Cycle in 2011 and B at 3rd Cycle in 2017 by NAAC, Bangluru and is one of reputed institute affiliated to Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur. The college is recognized by the Government of Maharashtra's Department of Social Justice and Special Assistance wide its resolution No. 92/93 office/5B/2678 dated 29th Sept. 1992. Grant-in-aid by Government of Maharashtra's Department of Social Justice and Special Assistance. College is recognized with 2f on 01/10/1996.

Vision: To define future through qualitative, enriching and affordable education.

Mission: To create next generation, citizens of character, strength & confidence through focused teaching, field work training, all round grooming, individual attention and personality enhancement to produce a cadre of professional social workers with value based social work education to promote competent human functioning.

IQAC INITTATIVE

To promote faculty members to conduct online classes with advance pedagogy. Due to COVID-19 all faculty members suggested to connect the students through various social media for their academic teaching and counselling. 2) IQAC promote online training for faculty to develop online teaching learning mode through the various software like Google meet, Google Classroom, Zoom Platform. 3) IQAC recommended to set up the online facility for all types of academic and administrative work including online examination, internal viva-voce. IQAC promote to various department and faculty members to conduct the seminar and workshops according to their academic requirement. 4) To motivate faculty members to use this pandemic period for attending academic development training program as well as seminar and conferences. Besides, IQAC promote to concentrate on research publication in journals, edited books and similar. 5) IQAC inspires to faculty and students to conduct online and off line programme to aware the society about the COVID-19 pandemic. Under this awareness programe our group of students organized helping campaign like awareness, distribution of food, mask, sanitizer in local areas.

CURRICULUM DELIVERY OF THE SESSION

Effective curriculum delivery of Social Work Syllabus and Practicum including field work are planned at different levels - ensuring awareness and preparedness of students, actual dealing with the curriculum during the semester and monitoring student uptake and teaching progress on the

curriculum. Curriculums and syllabus are available to students through university website, college prospectus and besides copies available in respective departments and the library for student use.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Government of Maharashtra declared closure of colleges during lockdown period from 15th March 2020 up to further order. As per University Notification permission for online Classes were given from 17/08/2020 and the First session Classes Started through online Mode then offline classes started from 15 February 2021, but from 6th April 2021, online classes commenced again as per government guidelines. As per the further government and RTMNU guidelines objective based exams were taken and the students were promoted to next session.

At the beginning of the session 2020-2021 subject teachers spend early time on the orientation about curriculum, checking student preparation and carrying out bridge or support activities as necessary through online mode using different software and apps like Goggle meet, Zoom, Google Classroom. Faculty actively participates in the curriculum design by conducting syllabus revision, workshops in which subject experts are invited to discuss and share their ideas. The faculty also attends similar workshops conducted by the university. Academic flexibility and bridging the gap between curriculum and field is achieved by conducting seminars and tie-ups through MoUs with GOs & NGOs. The institute caters to the needs of slow learners through extra inputs in remedial classes. Social awareness and community service is inculcated in the students through various field activities. The institute regularly conducts the feedback on curriculum & teaching learning process. The outcomes of feedback are taken for corrective measures.

Academic schedule and the requirements at the department level as par the action plans formed. Teaching plans includes courses outcomes, course objectives, content topics, reference books and expected outcomes from the students by learning through the topics prepared by respective faculty members at the beginning of each semester. The actual delivery of social work curriculum is done through a variety of approaches and methods, trying to bring in application oriented, hands-on experiences of learning, drawing on the constructivist approach to teaching-learning.

Attempts are made to enrich the curriculum delivery by the use of ICT, online resources and multimedia activities and by the diversity of teaching strategies like online lectures, group discussions, student presentations, and assignments. Efforts are also made to adapt the curriculums as relevant to the needs and interests of the student. Since it has no freedom or control over the centrally prescribed curriculum of the affiliating university.

In this session 2020-2021 in order to monitor student learning and teaching progress, regular assessment is carried out, though online periodic class tests, unit tests, and assignments. In all these processes, students receive regular support from the faculty, while peer support is also

encouraged and promoted. In addition, the members of the faculty are available to regular mentoring and counselling, both in academic as well as personal matters.

IMPLEMENTATION OF ACADEMIC CALENDAR IN THE SESSION

The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) follows in three steps namely internal assessment of theory, social work practicum with individual evaluation through the different phases; whereas due to COVID-19 pandemic all types of internal evaluation done with online mode in the session 2020-21 as like following practice done in regular mode and partially in online mode due to pandemic. institution follows the academic calender given by university for the execution of CIE.

Theory:-

In the theory classes advanced pedagogy are adopted for achieving the objectives of maximizing students centric learning and leadership for professional social work practice.

- Continuous monitoring of attendance in online classes on different platform by class teachers.

- Telephonic interaction with students remaining absent persistently.

-Assignments, online quiz and webinars organized on various topics to complete the major units of the theory papers.

-Students are assigned various tasks like seminar, planning, taking leadership in organizing various programmes on relevant topic on the basis of their special skills in communication, organization etc.

Social Work Practicum:-

-Students are continuously evaluated during the individual and online individual and group conferences held weekly by the college supervisors to guide and monitor the field work practice at their home town due to COVID-19 pandemic.

- Continuous feedback collected from agency supervisors where students are placed.

The institution conducted its Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of the college students through making the link of Google Form for Question paper/MCQs and shared it on class wise WhatsApp group along with the details about the duration and marks allotted for the examination and other required details. If there are 25 MCQs in the exam the time allotment is 45 minutes and for the 40 MCQs the time allotment is 1 hour.

Result of the examination based on the given Answer Keys shared to the subject teacher. So far as the ATKT students are there for whom the university asked to conduct the examination, in such case the question paper shared on the respected students' email for the examination purpose and collected for the evaluation done by the subject teacher. All above examination process done by the examination committee under the guidance of the principal of the institution and the committee In-charge execute the process of the same.

For theory, the exams on the lines of the University pattern are conducted. Similarly, preparatory viva for Social Work Practicum and Research Dissertation is also practiced for final year students. The college follows the modalities of conducting the Continuous Internal Evaluation as prescribed by the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur. In the last five years there have been several changes in the mode of evaluation based on the need of professional Social Work Education Program. During the initial years emphasis was on academic activity and presentations which aimed at fostering peer learning and mentoring, as well as building public speaking skills of students.

Internal assessment for theory papers prescribed in the syllabus in which 20 marks for set of two-four questions / topics for assignments and university examination conducted for the remaining 80 marks. Besides College examination committee conducts examination for the college as well as university and the subject teacher conducts the unit test also. Each department has worked out the details of how the assessment will be carried out for each paper taking care that learning objectives of each paper are achieved through the different assignments.

For theory papers it has been kept in mind that the assignments should not only test the knowledge base of the students but also foster creativity and out-of the-box thinking. It is a method of assessing whether learning outcomes for all courses are being achieved. It provides an opportunity to relook at and modify teaching strategies if the students are not performing well. Students who miss the assignments due to ill health or participation in extracurricular activities of the college are given an opportunity to give the assignment on an alternate date. Examination papers are set by both external and internal examiners wherein a balance of questions from every unit of the course is given with equal weightage to each of the units of each of the courses.

DEAL WITH THE CROSS-CUTTING ISSUE BY THE INSTITITON

The Institution has always believed in integrating gender issues, environmental problems, human values and ethical considerations in its curriculum. This is transacted both by curricular and co-curricular means. Values appropriate to the level of learning and attitudinal change appropriate to the social work profession are ensured at the end of the programs. Ethical behavior –Social work is a profession which has its own ethics and principles, we look forward to its internalization by the students. The Institution has always believed in integrating gender issues, environmental problems, human values and ethical considerations in its curriculum. This is transacted both by curricular and co-curricular means.

Curricular Related:The course of Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) and the Master of Social Work (MSW) focuses extensively on Human rights, gender issues, sustainability and environment with the aim of inculcating these values into thought process of the students. At these levels each core subject also imparts values. Theory papers inculcate the professional values as well as methods of the professional social work education clarify the different social issues of the society for which the need of humanity is playing the vital role. The curriculum design ensures that core human values, professional ethics and sensitization to human rights and values that are globally relevant like sustainability and gender studies happen insidiously in the learner.

At the MSW III & IV Semester level, the curriculum through its different five specializations ensures that core values continue to be looked at in varied subjects. Service as a value and sensitization to gender equity is intensively dealt with, under the community-oriented subjects and the field work and practical those are built into the subjects. The learner graduates with the values of creating a career while safe guarding the environment and ensuring equity in the allocation of resources as well as addressing issues in all marginalized sections of the community. Certificate courses runs in Counseling and Human Rights.

Co-curricular related:

The curriculum is supported by a host of Co-curricular activities which is focusing on varied human values.

The SAKHA Women Cell/ICC (Internal Complaints Cell)/VISHAKHA : organizes online sessions on Sexual Harassment Issues and means to tackle them as well as on Women's empowerment.

Wellness Centre is ready in this session for advocacy to provide basic health services to the poor women, children, elder person and needy one in the society. Health as a life value is taken up by the Health committee as well as by celebrations of the International Yoga Day to inculcate a proactive and healthful behavior with the help and collaboration of Government District Hospital, Bhandara.

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell conducts sessions on professional values in addition to preparing students for a career, besides all departments organize seminars and talks to integrate issues of global relevance and values into the learner's mind thus preparing them to take responsibility for the issues that need to be addressed and make them good citizens.

College ensures availability related to the Advance Pedagogy based support structures and makes facilities available for teachers to develop skills among students like interactive learning, collaborative learning and independent learning among the students through participatory and student centric teaching learning practices through the online mode. AV (Audio-Visual) materials like e-resource, films, documentaries, videos, clippings are used. Students are encouraged to prepare posters and enact street plays based on contemporary social issues. Learning receives an impetus by using ICT, library resources, LED Screen classrooms, Study tour and village camp activities are the special occasions where students are in leadership roles and help the faculty in planning and implementation of the academic program.

USE ICT TOOLS FOR EFFECTIVE TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS

Every faculty as per the given situation adopts innovative methods for teaching which help the students to understand the subject thoroughly. Some innovative approaches include use of ICT, Use of Case studies, Display and use of models and charts prepared by students. Debates, role playing, skits, workshops. Infrastructural and ICT facilities are provided by the institution. Sufficient number of books, journals and E- resources are made available in the library. Internet and Wi-Fi facility is available for students and staff. Class rooms with LED Screen, Seminars, workshops, skill labs and conferences are regularly organized on relevant contemporary issues by inviting experts from respective fields. This helps in fostering the global competencies and promotion of use of modern technology. The students acquire various skills such as soft skills, professional skills, intervention skills, life skills, personal skills etc.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

The Institution ensures that all students are aware of the evaluation process through the college prospectus which is updated one. The Orientation program (online mode) held at the beginning of academic year apprises students and their parents of the evaluation process and the schedule. In each of the departments, for each subject being taught at undergraduate and postgraduate level a senior faculty member is nominated as mentor/coordinator who then coordinates curriculum transaction with other faculty members teaching the subject during the semester.

Before the session begins, teaching plans are prepared and discussed among staff and students along with the mode of evaluation. Further, the examination committee of the college has recommended a basic structure for the continuous internal assessment of theory and practical with

guidelines for dealing with absenteeism. The faculty members of each of the departments have a certain amount of flexibility in deciding on the kind of assignment so that creativity is not compromised.

Guidelines for teachers and students for internal assessments are prepared as per the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur guidelines and are made available to the faculty. Examination Committee along with the other committees monitors the continuous evaluation in theory and practical to ensure uniformity across courses and departments through the online mode due to the COVID-19 pandemic. McQs were prepared for the examination link and shared the same to the students' email address.

STUDENT SATISFACTORY SURVEY OUTCOME SESSION 2020-2021

Report on results and details of Students Satisfaction Survey (2020-2021)

Athawale College of Social Work is the institute which got embedded with inherent closed loop system corrects itself through feedbacks/surveys on continuous basis. Students satisfaction survey (SSS) is one among these surveys. This survey includes majorly the questionnaire recommended by NAAC. Apart from Teaching- Learning and evaluation aspects, the survey has included infrastructural and welfare aspects too. The organization of survey, guidelines, questionnaire and the results are provided as follows.

Under Criterion II of Teaching – Learning and Evaluation:

Regarding the coverage of syllabus, 96% of students satisfied with the coverage more than 70 percent. The students of 90 to 96% appreciated the preparedness of teachers with the remark 'Thoroughly' and the communication with the remark 'Very effective'. The evaluation process and transparency in the system is well applaud by 90% of the students. Having the continuous efforts put by institute, 83% of students mentioned that the field trips/internships are arranged on regular basis. 91% of students got satisfied with the practical examples and applications mentioned by the teacher while explaining the concepts. Regarding the mentoring, 90% of students strongly agree the effort put by the institute to improve the quality of teaching and learning process. The Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work are appreciated to great extent by 91% students. The teaching and learning process in the institute with the implementation of modern and distinctive pedagogical methods, could gain the satisfaction levels up to

EXCELLENT and Good from more than 90% students.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

The college is committed to holistic and integrated education that aims at making students intellectually sharp, culturally creative, emotionally resilient and physically strong. College conducts number of extension activities through various campaigns under the guidance of faculty members. Number of departments has carried out various activities for the empowerment and benefit of the neighbourhood communities that has benefitted the community and the students as well. Extension activities have made notable impact on sensitizing students towards issues like

gender disparity, Environment conservation, social harmony, dowry, superstition eradication, female foeticide etc. The institution promote the college neighbourhood network namely village camps, study tour Agency visit, Placement and field work to acquire the services and training for contributing the community development. Based on the theoretical knowledge students have been organized different programmes on burning issues with the help and guidance of the faculty for the welfare of the community. Besides, it is strongly helpful to the holistic development of the students. Institution always promotes students to participate in social movements and activities like Swachh Bharat Mission, Pluse Polio, Beti Bachao Andolan, Women Empowerment so on. Students has been organizing various social issues based programmes such as street play, drama and so on in the community so that community people get sensitized about their own problems and taking participation to solve it. And all this done by the students under the guidance of respected faculty.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND PHYSICAL FACILITIES

The college has augmented its infrastructure systematically and continuously over the years. The college has state of the art infrastructural facilities like adequate classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, staff Common room, computer lab and Conference hall, Smart Class, reading rooms, ramps, rest room and wash room for the physically challenged students (divyangajan). The college has excellent classrooms to conduct regular classes. To ensure its optimal utilization, besides conducting regular classes, the classrooms are used for conducting Remedial Coaching, Certificate Courses, Annual and semester examinations; Mentoring sessions, and the conference hall for workshop, seminar, Students activities, Indoor Competitions, Parent-Teacher Meet, Alumni Meet, Book Exhibitions, Poster Presentation etc. The library has Reading facility for students and all staff with quality reading resources and it has an adequate capacity where users can seat and study comfortably at the same time.

The college has the Maintenance Committee under College Development Committee (CDC) that oversees the maintenance of buildings, classrooms and laboratories such as computer lab and skill lab. Adequate in-house staff is employed to meticulously maintain hygiene, cleanliness and infrastructure on the campus so as to provide a congenial learning environment. Classrooms, staffrooms, seminar halls and office are cleaned and maintained regularly by the staff assigned as par. Wash rooms and rest rooms are well maintained. Dustbins are placed in each classroom. The green cover of the campus is well maintained by a full time gardener.

Our college Library has been systematically computerized in Function using LIBMAN. Master Software. It is powerful and easy to use system. The online public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is remarkably effective and efficient. Lib-Man is a program that will maintain a Library system. The system manages book information Library visitors borrowing etc. Titles of books have been entered in this software and the work is in progress. The Library also started the "Online Public Access Catalogue" (OPAC)

In order to create awareness about the automated services regular information literacy programs for the student and teachers are carried out in the Library throughout the year. These programmes primarily include searching of OPAC Internet awareness and demonstration of Open Access Educational Resources available on internet etc.
