Introduction: A One Day State Level Workshop on "National Education Policy: Opportunity and Challenges in Social Work Education" was organized on 4th October, 2023 by Orange City College of Social Work, Nagpur, Board of Studies of Social Work, RTMNU, Nagpur, Athawale College of Social Work, Bhandara in collaboration with Maharashtra Association of Social Work Educators, Vidyapeeth Shikshan Manch and Professional Social Work and Education Foundation. The workshop was organised under the patronage of Educational Stalwart and Ace Administrator Late Dr. Chandansingh Rotele, Hon. Founder President, Dr. Kedarsingh Rotele, Hon. President, Orange City College of Social Work, Nagpur, Madam Kirantai Rotele, Hon. Former Senate Member, RTMNU, Nagpur and Madam Kajol Rotele, Hon. Director, OCCSW, Nagpur.

The National Education Policy 2020 is proving to be a game changer in the field of pedagogy. Unlike the older system of education with the rigid framework, the NEP provides students a bouquet of opportunities of learning with multiple entries and exits. It is important that before the NEP becomes an integral part of the system, the nuances of the NEP should be understood by one and all. Consequently, the present workshop on "National Education Policy: Opportunity and Challenges in Social Work Education" was organized to discuss the different dimensions of the same.

The inaugural session was graced by Dr. Sanjay Dudhe, Hon. Pro Vice Chancellor, RTMNU, Nagpur as the inaugurator of the workshop. In his valuable discourse, Dr. Sanjay Dudhe explains the importance of NEP and its provisions which will be available for the future generation. He said that the NEP saw the light of the day to change the 75 years old western education system imposed by the British government on India. The system was ended to produce the mediocre clerical class of the people in India. However, the NEP would pave the way for the intellectual class of the people having roots in the Indian system. The age old 10+2 system of the education has been replaced by 5+3+3+4 where the students enrolling in to the school is developed intellectually on the mental faculty of the age.

In the higher education, the student can opt for the subjects of his/her choice not limiting to any stream. It means the student who must be interested in some of the subject from science faculty, even if he belongs to the Arts or Commerce faculty can opt for the mentioned subject and create one's own basket of the subjects. The student can choose the core subject in which he is interested which can be called as the major subjects. Similarly, the subjects from different streams of the choice can be called as the minor subject. Thus, student has the choice of crafting his own vocation based on his interest. Such student, once enrolling in to any course of higher education has own storage of the credits so achieve after the successful completion of the particular level of course. The credit score so collected at the end of the successful completion of each level of higher education are accumulated in his own store called as 'Academic Bank of Credit' (ABC) which not only remains with the student until the education is pursued but also is helpful for deciding the future course of academic of the student.

He explained how a student can reap maximum benefits of it by understanding the latent opportunities of choosing different courses or different subjects in these courses that may be of the choice of the student. The present system is made to provide maximum benefit to the student. Moreover, the percentage of the drop outs can be mitigated by providing the student certificate, diploma, degree & honour at different stage the student may opt to exit.

Dr. Kedarsingh Rotele, Hon. President, GUSS opined in his discourse that the National Education Policy 2020 demands the equipment of the teacher with all kinds of knowledge not restricted to the subject. The teacher should be able to provide full satisfaction to different queries of the students. Hence it is the responsibility of the teacher to brace themselves in such a way that they are able to satisfy maximum queries of the students. He viewed that NEP has so many unfathomed layers to it that a one-day workshop is insufficient it. There should be at least three days workshop to evaluate all the dimensions of the NEP.

Dr. Kalpana Pandey, Hon. President, Vidyapith Shikshan Manch, Nagpur opined that the onus of the restructuring and implementation of the NEP by default falls on the shoulders of the teaching faculties. Hence, they should be aware of the different aspects of NEP. Foremost, it is important to disperse the prejudices regarding the NEP. She said that the NEP is nothing but the renovation of the older and ancient values upheld by the Indian culture. She said that the ancient Indian Universities like Takshashila, Nalanda, etc., were always disseminating the knowledge and information that the student's study in the modern era.

She opined that during the Gurukul system of education the privilege of being a teacher was restricted to a Brahmin only. This was a faulty practice. The criteria of being a teacher should not be the religion but the knowledge of the teacher. The teacher shoulders the entire responsibility of the students to make him a good student and citizen of the society. Hence the teacher was respected above all and his responsibility was taken by the entire society.

She cited the example of Turkey, when at the time of the independence of the Turkey from the Portugal yoke, there arise the question as to what would be the national language of the country? It was the result of the calculative and well thought perspective of the country that it would take at least 15 years to get rid of the influence of the Portuguese language and established a national language. Speaking about the NEP, she said that the students have the entire lights and power to choose what he/she ones to study. She concluded that the NEP is like a vast ocean which has many gems hidden beneath it. It depends upon the facilitators to find out these gems by getting dipper in to this ocean and used the same for its academic richness.

Mrs. Kirantai Rotele, Hon. Ex Senate Member, RTMNU, Nagpur, Dr. Naresh Kolte, Hon. Chairman, Board of Studies of Social Work, RTMNU, Nagpur and Dr. Mahendrakumar Meshram, Officiating Principal, OCCSW, Nagpur facilitated as the Chief Guest.

The Inaugural session conducted by Dr. Kavita Kanholkar, convener of the workshop & Member, Board of studies, RTMNU, Nagpur. The vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Kalpana Jamgade, Member of BOS, RTMNU, Nagpur.

In the first session, Dr. Ambadas Mohite guided on "Introduction to the Nuances of National Education Policy-2020". The session was chaired by Dr. Laxmikant Deshpand, Hon. Member, Board of Studies of Social Work, RTMNU.

In the second session on "Challenges and Opportunities Unfolded in Social Work Education" guidance was provided by Dr. Ambadas Mohite. The session was chaired by Dr. Swati Dharmadhikari, Officiating Principal, Tirpude College of Social Work, Nagpur.

In these session, Dr. Mohite at length discussed the impact of different education commission Mudliar Commission, Kothari Commission, Janardan Reddy Commission, National Program

of Action 1951, National Knowledge Commission 2005, and the National Education Policy 2020 recently. He opined that by default the Directive Principles of Constitution provides the light of compulsory education to the children in the age group of 6 to 14 yrs.

He said that India is the country of youth with maximum numbers of youth population in India where the average is 27 years for youth as compared to the other Eastern country like Japan with average age of 40 yrs. And western countries like Europe with average age of 35 years. He opined that the NEP being multidisciplinary is the biggest favourable features. He viewed that the NEP should ultimately be instrumental in realization of the goals of Sustainable Development. The Sustainable Development Goal 2030 are prominently 17 goals giving education with consistency utmost importance to the education at the elementary level throughout the country. He viewed that the 10+2 education system has been replaced by 5+3+3+4+4. He also opined that the water tight compartment of different streams like, Arts, Commerce and Science will be non-existing and the student would have the freedom of choice for choosing any stream at any point of time after the completion of a one-year course or two semesters.

He viewed that the current Gross Enrolment Ratio which happens to be 30% in India, it is the aim of the NEP 2020 to raise it to 50%. As compared to the global GER. Its aim is the all-round development and a holistic intellectual development of the student. The student should be able to develop the traits like nobility, character, scientific temper, humanity, humility, rationality, empathy etc. It is important that not only the Intelligence Quotient but also the Emotional Quotient should be developed so that the students can progress in life. He at length discussed the concept of Discipline, Interdisciplinary, Multidisciplinary and Cross Discipline.

He said that with the view of promoting multidisciplinary approach in education, due efforts are taken that the single faculty colleges do not lag behind. Thus, the colleges with mono faculty can form cluster with the colleges with multi faculty in the adjacent area. With this view, the colleges can form the cluster by signing MOU. He discussed regarding the Credit Based System by the allocation of the credit-based system on different activities like, the plantation, blood donation, field work, etc. The different courses can be pursued like School Social Worker. He concluded that with the view of increasing the enrolment among the students the education in hybrid mode is encouraged.

The session on "Introduction to the Nuances of National Education Policy-2020" was conducted by Ms. Kalpana Mukunde and vote of thanks was proposed by Prof. Rachana Dhadade. The session was chaired by Dr. Laxmikant Deshpande, Hon. Member, BOS, Social work, RTMNU, Nagpur. During the session, Dr. Deshpande opined that the basics of the Indian social work constitute to be the overall structure of the NEP 2020 stands on the firm footing of the social work. As far as the social work of India is concerned, the backbone of the same remains counselling. Hence the by-product of the social work is fully equipped to face any kind of problem. Moreover, the responsibility of bringing pragmatic changes in the social structures falls upon the stakeholders of the social work curriculum.

The second session on "Challenges and Opportunities Unfolded in Social Work Education" was chaired Dr. Swati Dharmadhikari, Officiating Principal, Tirpude College of Social Work, Nagpur. During the session, she opined that it is necessary that separate guidelines of NEP should be formulated according to the stream discipline. It is not possible that one hat would fit to all the sizes of head. The NEP promotes autonomy of the institution

so that they should be able to conduct the respective work according to the existing state, types of students, faculties, resources, geographical areas of the respective institution. However, it is the responsibility of the institutions as well that they should make the most of the autonomy granted to them. The NEP should cater to the professional and nonprofessional courses as well. Thus, it is important that significant and fruitful changes should be made in the NEP.

The third session dedicated to Open Discussion was conducted by Dr. Chandrashekhar Malviya and vote of thanks was proposed by Prof. Sulok Raghuwanshi. The session chaired by Dr. Naresh Kolte, Hon. Chairman Studies of Social Work, RTMNU, Nagpur, Mr. Amol Rotele, Hon. Ex. Senate Member, RTMNU, Nagpur, Dr. Ashok Shahane, Dr. Vilas Ghode, Dr. Vijay Tupe, Hon. Member, Board of Studies, RTMNU, Nagpur. During the session the participant unanimously opined that there is dire need of organizing such workshops to understand various concepts regarding NEP and dispel their strong opinion that unless each stakeholder of NEP understands the dimensions of NEP, there would be end number of problems regarding the implementation. It is also important that not only workshops on similar lines are organized but also training sessions by inviting experts from different fields of NEP should be organized. Dr. Naresh Kolte in his presidential address assured that all the key points emerging from the discussion carried out during the workshop would be duly forwarded to the BOS and necessary action would be taken for the benefit of all.

The Valedictory Session was graced by Dr. Kedarsingh Rotele, Hon. President, Gram Utkarsh Shikshan Sanstha, Nagpur, Dr. Naresh Kolte, Hon. Chairman, BOSSW, RTMNU, Nagpur, Dr. Mahendrakumar Meshram, off. Principal, OCCSW, Nagpur and Prof. Amolsingh Rotele, Former Member of Senate, RTMNU, Nagpur. During the valedictory session, The significant and fruitful feedback was provided by Dr. Ram Buttke, Asst. Prof. Kamptee College of Social Work, Kamptee, Dr. Chandrabhan Khangar, Athwale College of Social Work, Chimur & Prof. Sanjay Fulkar, Kumbhalkar Evening College of Social Work, Nagpur. It was unanimously opined that the NEP 2020 is not that complex as it appears to be. The technical sessions followed by the open discussion were potent in dispelling different misconception and inhibitions regarding the policy and proved it to be much a friendly and amiable policy for all the stakeholders. It was also opined that owing to the large reference of the subject, NEP 2020 can not be comprehended in a single workshop and there is need for organizing similar workshops or for that matter training sessions spanning to week to fully uncovered the major and minor nuances of the policy.

The workshop could be successful with the motivation of Dr. Satish Chafle, Hon. General Secretary, Vidyapith Shikshan Manch, Nagpur, Dr. Sanjay Fulkar, Hon. General Secretary, MASWE, Nagpur, Dr. Kavita Kanholkar, Member, Board of Studies, RTMNU, Nagpur, Dr. Chandrashekhar Malviya, Member, Board of Studies, RTMNU, Nagpur, Prof. Mr. Dipratna Raut, Associate Professor, OCCSW, Nagpur, Mr. Sulok Raghuwanshi, Assistant Professor, OCCSW, Nagpur, Ms. Kalpana Mukunde, Librarian, OCCSW, Nagpur and all the teaching and non-teaching staff, OCCSW, Nagpur.
